

Gospel: The Promised Messiah

Isaiah 53:1-12

Opening Question: How do we know that Yeshua (Jesus) is the Savior of mankind?

Review: Quickly go over the story of the fall of Adam and Eve in Genesis 2:10-25, 3:1-19. This makes it easier for the students to see the bigger picture as each topic is related.

Opening Activity: Watch “The Promise of a Savior Isaiah 9:6-7, Micah 5:2” by Saddleback Kids on YouTube. <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=KEpSXxL4Nn4>

Read and Discuss: Have students take turns reading and discussing Isaiah 53:1-12. Although telling the story again seems redundant, it is crucial for students to hear it at least twice. A key to successfully getting interaction is by challenging students with questions that require more than a yes or no answer. Remember to use the time to answer any questions students have and emphasize any key points that relate to our theme of the Gospel.

Prayer: Close in prayer after asking students for prayer requests. It would also be good for students to pray for each other.

Memory Verse: Have students practice the following memory verse:

“For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish, but have eternal life. For God did not send the Son into the world to judge the world, but that the world might be saved through Him.” John 3:16-17

Homework Check: Check students workbook to make sure that they completed their homework from last week. If they did, initial the top of the first page. If they did not, then have them work on it in class while the rest of the students play the game at the end. It might seem harsh, but this will create a desire within students to complete their homework on time.

Homework: Remind students to do the following assignments by the next Shabbat class.

- Practice memorizing John 3:16-17.
- Read Isaiah 53:1-12 and answer the questions in the workbook.

Game: Once you have done all the above things, play the game that you have picked out. If you forgot to pick out a game, capture the flag is a favorite that students will most likely know how to play.
